#### **OVERVIEW**

SIERRA CANYON SCHOOL is a nonprofit, independent,

nondenominational, coeducational day school in the northern San Fernando Valley area of Los Angeles with an enrollment of 1,200 students in grades Pre-K-12. Admission to Sierra Canyon School is selective. Sierra Canyon School is located on 42 beautiful, rustic acres and has two campuses across the street from each other: the Lower Campus for students in grades Pre-Kindergarten through Sixth and the state-of-the-art Upper Campus for students in grades Seven through Twelve. The Class of 2025 is Sierra Canyon's seventeenth graduating senior class.
