#### **OVERVIEW**

SIERRA CANYON SCHOOL is a nonprofit, independent,

nondenominational, coeducational day school in the northern San Fernando Valley area of Los Angeles with an enrollment of 1,150 students in grades Pre-K-12. Admission to Sierra Canyon School is selective. Sierra Canyon School is located on 42 beautiful, rustic acres and has two campuses across the street from each other: the Lower Campus for students in grades Pre-Kindergarten through Sixth and the state-of-the-art Upper Campus for students in grades Seven through Twelve. The Class of 2024 is Sierra Canyon's sixteenth graduating senior class.

#### 2022-2023 HIGHLIGHTS

- Won CIF-SS Championships in Football, Girls' Volleyball, Girls' Basketball, and Boys' Swimming - setting a school record for the most teams to earn this achievement in a single year.
- Twenty-five students from Grades 11 and 12 were inducted into the Cum Laude Society.
- The Varsity Math Team took 1st place in their division at the Princeton University Mathematics Competition. Eleven math students were invited to the American Invitational Math Examination and three students qualified for the USA Math Olympiad.
- Four student films were selected by the All-American High School Film Festival, and one student was nominated for the Emerging Talent Award.
- Six students traveled to San Antonio to participate in the Student Diversity and Leadership and People of Color Conferences.
